# BROTHER RON "ADISA" CLARK

The honor of being judged exceptional by one's own peers and comrades is bestowed upon only a very few of us after we leave this plane. Brother Adisa was truly one of those individuals that humbly yet forthrightly achieved that distinction. We may be asking ourselves just what was so special about this Afrikan Warrior that he deserves such an honor above and beyond the fact that he helped many Black People rid themselves of their addiction to drugs. The answer is not readily apparent to many of us because it really requires a

broad enough perspective of his overall commitment and contribution in the field of drug abuse and prevention and a clear understanding of the history and evolution of the Black Liberation Movement. With this basic premise in mind, we can conclude that the most valuable contribution that Brother Adisa made to the Washington DC Black Community was that he was able to link the overall struggle for the liberation and dignity of our people (often called our Freedom Movement) to the individual travails of many Black People to fully

attempt to extricate themselves from the personal demons of drug abuse and dependency. He courageously showed us how becoming a part of our collective movement to be a free and self-determining people, can effectively and systematically address our personal issues with chemical addiction. He demonstrated how to effectively link the two by helping to serve oneself and our community through a process that can result in the recovery for both.

What he did in the DC Black Community was to pioneer the link between Black advocacy and the personal conquest of addiction. He offered a path away from self-destruction to becoming an asset to our collective aspirations. He showed us a road to a better you, which can and should mean a better community. He took what he learned through his own trials and tribulations and built a bridge to our liberation for both the person and our people.

The vehicle that Brother Adisa used to accomplish his very valuable contribution to our community was the creation of RAP Incorporated, the premier drug treatment program in the District of Columbia and an important model for Black survival for other communities to follow. In doing so, RAP made use of the NGUZO SABA (The Seven Principles of Kwanzaa) to help provide purpose, direction and fortitude to program participants. RAP made excellent use of Afrikan Culture and History to connect participants with an alternative to their problematic behavior. Consequently, RAP strategically built wonderful community unity among them in the best tradition of our Afrikan Ancestors. We will eternally and lovingly be grateful to him for his important contribution to our people's march forward to victory! Long Live the Beautiful Afrikan Spirit of Ron Adisa Clark!!

# WHAT IS KWANZAA?

Kwanzaa, a holiday (or Holy Day) based upon the African tradition of celebrating the harvesting of the first fruits, was created and introduced for Black People in the United States by Dr. Maulana Karenga in 1966.

Kwanzaa is the ingathering of the people, a special reverence for the Creator and creation, a commemoration of the past, a recommitment to our highest ideals, and a celebration of all that is good. It is a time of reflecting, reassessing, recommitting, rewarding, and rejoicing in an atmosphere of peace, love and unity. Kwanzaa is a cultural and political expression to reaffirm our African Heritage and organize our people for the struggle of total Black Liberation.

Kwanzaa is celebrated for seven days: December 26th through January 1st. The seven days are based upon the Nguzo Saba (The Seven Principles), with each day being symbolic of one of the principles.

- December 26th Umoja (Unity)
- December 27th Kujichagulia (Self-Determination)
- December 28th Ujima (Collective Work & Responsibility)
- December 29th Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics)
- December 30th Nia (Purpose)
- December 31st Kuumba (Creativity)
- · January 1st Imani (Faith)



# THERE ARE SEVEN SYMBOLS OF KWANZAA

- Mkeka (Straw Mat) tradition and history; the foundation on which all else rests
- · Kinara (Candle Holder) original stalk from which we come; our African ancestors
- Mishumaa Saba (7 Candles) Nguzo Saba; The Seven Principles firmly rooted in the traditions of our ancestors
- · Muhindi (Ears of Corn) represents children and all the hopes and challenges attached to them
- Kikombe cha Umoja (Unity Cup)
- Mazao (Crops) the collective fruits of our labor; seeds sown by the children
- · Zawadi (Gifts) rewards for our achievements

# WHAT TO DO AND WHEN TO DO IT

## December 19th

Gather and arrange Kwanzaa symbols. Any other decorations (African carvings, straw baskets) should be in a red, black and green color scheme, symbolizing the bendera ya taifa (Flag of the Black Nation):

Red - the blood of our people

Black - the collective color of all Black people

Green - land, Mother Africa, life and our future (we build together)

## Arrange the symbols on a low table as follows:

- 1. Spread the Mkeka
- 2. Place the Kinara in the center of the Mkeka
- 3. Place the Muhindi on either side of the Kinara, one ear of corn for each child, or one as a symbol of prosperity
- 4. Creatively place the Zawadi, Kikombe, and a basket of Mazao on the Mkeka
- 5. Place 1 Black Mishumaa in the center of the Kinara, with 3 Green on the right, and 3 Red on the left.

## December 26th - January 1st

Greeting – greet each other in Kiswahili asking "Habari Gani?" (What's the news or what's happening?) Answer with the principle for that day. For example, on December 26th, respond with "Umoja."

**Economic Empowerment** — only shop at Black-owned businesses during the seven days of Kwanzaa. In the spirit of Kwanzaa and Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics) we as African people should support these same Black businesses, such as trade in the African marketplace in the calendar, all year round.

Fasting — fast from sunrise to sunset to help cleanse the body, discipline the mind, and uplift the spirit.

**Libation (Ancestral Communion)** — an elder or leader should pour libation, using water or juice, from the Kikombe into a bowl or potted plant, to honor our ancestors.

**Candle Lighting Ceremony** — light one Mishumaa each day for the principle of that day, beginning with the black candle. which represents the first principle Umoja. Each day thereafter, alternately light the red and then the green candles. After each lighting, discuss the principle of the day. The ceremony should be held at a time when all family members, especially children, can participate.

Karamu (The Feast) — the Karamu is held on the night of December 31st, and should be a festive occasion. When possible, observe traditional African practices, e.g., African music, dance and storytelling, sitting on the floor or on pillows, and eating with the hands (no utensils). Libation, Candlelighting and Harambee are conducted at the Karamu.

Zawadi (Gift) — (They should not be mandatory, expensive or excessive). It is suggested that Zawadi be given to the children in one or two ways:

- 1. One gift each day, reinforcing the principle of that day.
- 2. One or more gifts on January 1st, the last day of Kwanzaa.

Personally made gifts are strongly encouraged over commercial purchases. Regardless of what else is given, there are two strongly suggested items: a book and heritage symbol. These two items reinforce our commitment to education and the richness of our cultural heritage.

The essence of Kwanzaa is a true appreciation of ourselves as Black People, collectively coming together to reflect on and enjoy the infinite beauty of being in the same family, organization, and community, sharing the same values, interests and aspirations, engaging in and committing to the same struggle.

To strive for and maintain unity in the family, community, nation and race.



## **KUJICHAGULIA** (Self-Determination)

To define ourselves, name ourselves, create for ourselves and speak for ourselves instead of being defined and spoken for by others.



## **UJIMA (Collective Work and Responsibility)**

To build and maintain our community together and make our brothers' and sisters' problems our problems and solve them together.



# **UJAMAA** (Cooperative Economics)

To build and maintain our own stores, shops and other businesses and profit from them together.



## NIA (Purpose)

To make our collective vocation the building and developing of our community in order to restore our people to their traditional greatness.



## **KUUMBA** (Creativity)

To do always as much as we can, in the way that we can, in order to leave our community more beautiful and beneficial than we inherited it.



## **IMANI** (Faith)

To believe with all our heart in our people, our parents, our teachers, our leaders and the righteousness and victory of our struggle.

# The Kwanzaa Now Campaign and the National Museum of African American History and Culture

DC Kwanzaa Planning Committee and many other Kwanzaa supporters are supporting the Kwanzaa Now Campaign because the National Museum of African American History and Culture has excluded the holiday Kwanzaa from its exhibits. The word Kwanzaa is only mentioned once in the museum's exhibit. The campaign goal is to encourage the museum to establish an appropriate Kwanzaa exhibit. Visit Kwanzaanow.org for more details

The globally celebrated Pan African holiday created by Dr. Maulana Karenga in 1966, grew out of the political and cultural struggles of the 1960s and it is embraced and strengthened by hundreds of organizations in this country and the African diaspora.

Kwanzaa is clearly a significant contribution to Black life and struggle; however, the museum has excluded it and by doing so it has reduced Black history and culture. African Americans began practicing Kwanzaa more than a half-century ago and now the holiday is observed by tens of millions of African descendants worldwide. It is arguably our most important cultural achievement from the Black Power Era of the Black Freedom Movement of the '60s.

# **How You Can Help**

Kwanzaa Now Campaign wants you, your family and friends to help us encourage Lonnie G. Bunch III, Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution (head of 19 museums, including the African American), to give Kwanzaa it's rightfully earned place in the National Museum of African American History and Culture; by doing so Mr. Bunch will build and protect the integrity of the museum and Kwanzaa.
